In Chapter 23, Jesus speaks to the crowds and his disciples (v. 1), addressing the spiritual failure of the scribes and Pharisees. Have you ever felt like a spiritual failure? You know, speaking when you shouldn't, judging when you don't really know. The tongue does more harm to the soul than we will even know or comprehend. Read the words below from: *The Diary of St. Faustina*:

118- A talkative soul is empty inside. It lacks both the essential virtues and intimacy with God. A deeper interior life, one of gentle peace and of that silence where the Lord dwells, is quite out of the question. A soul that has never tasted the sweetness of inner silence is a restless spirit which disturbs the silence of others. I have seen many souls in the depths of hell for not having kept their silence; they told me so themselves when I asked them what was the cause of their undoing. These were souls of religious. My God, what an agony it is to think that not only might they have been in heaven, but they might even have become saints! O Jesus, have mercy! # 119- I tremble to think that I have to give an account of my tongue. There is life, but there is also death in the tongue. The utter destruction of the Holy City and its temple would be fresh in Matthew's mind as he writes this Gospel.

About 2 months ago, I held a meeting for those interested in youth ministry (since Confirmation preparation will now happen primarily in 8th grade). We had three families show up, only one of whom had kids in high school. Based upon that response (a few others also called), I decided that it would be the best stewardship of our parish resources, and offer the best opportunities for our youth who want to be involved in youth ministry, that we would team up with another parish. After some discussions with the involved parties, I am happy to announce that St. Pius X will join with St. Robert Bellarmine parish in Flushing for Youth Ministry. This will give our students an opportunity to be in a larger-sized youth group, which will hopefully encourage attendance, and will have chances to participate in larger retreats and mission work that we couldn't offer by ourselves at St. Pius X. The Youth Minister, Nick Pobocik, will be introducing himself, and keeping us up-to-date on what our combined Youth Group is doing. For the foreseeable future, all meetings will take place at St. Robert in Flushing, but Fr. Gordon, the pastor of St. Robert, and I, along with Nick, will make annual evaluations of how best to run the combined program. I greatly encourage any of our high school youth to participate in these faith-building opportunities.

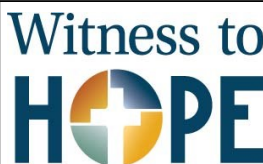

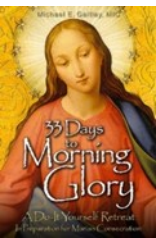
A NEW SHAPE TO RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN
